Item 2

Council Report 2021

Overview

2020-21 continued to challenge our individual and collective resilience. Mythology is full of three-headed monsters and this year we battled with COVID restrictions, severe weather conditions and Brexit, but made it safely through to enjoy a full golfing season.

With Government restrictions closing the Clubhouse from Christmas 2020 through to 26 April 2021 and limitations on the number of households who could play together, there was an ominous feeling of déjà vu in the early weeks of 2021.

These restrictions also delayed the opening of the new Pro Shop following it coming under the Club's direct management. Our new Golf Team comprising Ross, Graeme and Niall, temporarily became baristas, keeping members warm with hot drinks from the newly installed coffee machine while the Clubhouse remained closed. Difficulties with stock availability and delivery, especially golf clubs, has impacted on golf sales throughout the year, but members have enjoyed the various coaching programmes on offer. Council thanks members for the support which they have given to the Golf Team over the season.

Extreme ice, followed by flooding, delayed the start of the competitive season until May and detrimentally impacted course conditions. It was not long, however, before Neil and the Greens Team had both courses back to the high standard which members expect and many plaudits were received from visitors and guests alike.

With a new location for the marquee, new furniture and fantastic floral beds, the outdoor area was once again a popular resting place, both before and after a round. Many members enjoyed the outdoor barbecues on Championships Day and Members Day when we celebrated Frank and Sheila's retirement after 32 years with the Club.

It seems like every season seems to have a storm and 2021 belonged to Storm Arwen, the worst storm in 15 years, which wreaked havoc and devastation across the country. Thankfully the Clubhouse didn't lose power and we lost only a few trees.

Pursuant to the Club's Strategic Plan, the Club's appointed course architects, Edwards Design International (EDI), have carried out a review of the courses and practice facilities and their initial thoughts for possible short, medium and long-term projects which could be brought together in a masterplan have been reported to members for consideration and comment.

The year ended as it began, with social distancing and household mixing restrictions back in operation. This curtailed some of the normal end of year festivities.

Despite all the challenges set out above, the Club remains in a strong financial position; indeed due to a variety of exceptional circumstances, we delivered a considerable net surplus. The last 2 years have shown the importance of ensuring that we retain sufficient cash reserves to cover outgoings in the event of forced closures or weather damage. We have also put in place a capital improvements fund for ongoing investment in the courses and Clubhouse facilities.

Council thanks members for their continuing support throughout the year.

Course

The freezing ground conditions experienced at the start of 2021, which continued through into April, restricted pre-season maintenance and some of the planned winter projects. This resulted in the condition of the courses not being at the level we hoped for at the start of the season. However, when we started to get good grass growth in May, the playing conditions improved considerably. When STRI carried out their annual survey in July, they commended the excellent condition of the grass plant canopy and commented that the greens had only survived the extended freezing conditions due to the hard work which the Greens Team, led by Neil McLoughlin, Course Manager, and Head Greenkeepers, Dave Middleton and Adam Lindsey, had carried out in Autumn 2020. Many members also praised the course conditions in verbal and written notes to the Greens Team, which were very much appreciated.

Tree thinning has been carried out through the year pursuant to advice from our arboricultural consultant and thankfully we were spared the worst of Storm Arwen.

Council received a proposal from two members with suggestions to improve the winter course layout on Haughton. This was reviewed and many of the proposals have been implemented with positive feedback from members.

Flooding has continued to be an issue and after receiving members' feedback on course closures, a 'Course Closure Protocol' was developed as a guide for the Greens Team to ensure that a consistent approach is taken when deciding to close the courses and the conditions required to partially or fully re-open the courses for play.

Planning permission for the new maintenance shed was obtained. The initial construction tender prices were higher than expected due to market conditions which led to a further detailed review of the required space and how the existing greenkeeping facilities could be better utilised. We now believe that a smaller shed would suffice.

During the year safety concerns have arisen on the driving range which led to restrictions on the longer hitters. The flooding, range concerns and the location of the new maintenance shed were all intimated to the Club's appointed course architects, EDI, who have been reviewing the courses and practice facilities as part of the Strategic Plan objective of putting in place an overall masterplan. EDI presented their initial concept masterplan at the annual winter Information Evening and Council sought and received feedback from members on the proposals which feedback will be used to develop the next steps.

Council wishes to thank Neil, Dave, Adam, Marc, Andy, Dave, Cameron, Simon and Adam for all their efforts during the 2021 season.

Competitions

Congratulations to all our 2021 competition winners. It was a particularly successful year for Jason Bruce who won the inaugural Blairs Championship and became the first recipient of the Duncan Skinner Quaich and then became the Gents' Club Champion and winner of the Dunriach Cup, beating Jamie Hall in the final.

The Ladies' Club Championship was won by Susie Macleod, beating Carol Eddie.

The Senior Men's Club Championship was won by Alan Ross and the Gents' Handicap Championship was won by Dave Webster.

The Senior Ladies' Championship was won by Rhona Taylor and the Ladies' Handicap Championship was won by Rhona Pirie.

The Junior Club Championship was won by Jack Chambers and the Junior Handicap Championship was won by Ben Smith. The Armstrong Trophy was won by Alice Rhodes.

The four round Gents' Stroke Play Championship was won by Henri Charles.

We had home wins in our Gents' Open (David Macklin); Senior Gents' Open (Alex MacDonald); and Junior Open (Jake Kelly).

Thanks to our Pro Shop team for organising all the competition draws during the season.

Thanks also to everyone who represented the Club in external team and individual competitions. From juniors through to seniors, teams played in events such as the Pennant Leagues and interclub matches; the Jubilee Shield, the Journal Cup, Simmers Trophy, Dalswinton Trophy, Senior Northern Counties, Northern Counties Cup, the Lyon Double Foursomes and many more. Special congratulations to the ladies who won the Watt Duffus Handicap Trophy and the juniors who won the Off The Tee Trophy. The men were runners up to Murcar in the Maitland Shield.

Finance

The financial year to 30 September 2021 saw the Club deliver an overall net surplus of £179k after corporation tax. Consistent with the Club's financial policy, our budget was set to generate a somewhat more modest result, however there were a number of exceptional items in the year which contributed to the surplus which was actually achieved.

The Club made a one-off gain of £81k on the sale of 13 items of course equipment; the proceeds from which were used as a deposit against the new equipment. The Club also benefited from the 15% reduction in the VAT rate on food and soft drinks; a Government incentive for the hospitality industry which applied for the entire year. Similarly, the exemption from business rates applied throughout the year and the Club also received a backdated rates rebate following an appeal to the assessor against the 2017 rates increase.

While the closure of the Clubhouse for more than 4 months during the year resulted in the loss of almost all F&B income in that period, the financial impact for the Club was offset by the furlough scheme as well as the VAT reduction. In addition, Clubhouse overheads during that period were significantly reduced.

The opening of our new Pro Shop, originally planned for early March 2021, had to be postponed due to the lockdown restrictions. Despite the delayed start and subsequent Brexit/COVID related supply chain problems resulting in a shortage

of clubs for sale, Council is pleased with the financial performance for the first season, being a loss of £16k after members' discount. This is still a considerable saving on previous years.

The Club ended the year in a strong cash position with £528k in our working accounts with the Clydesdale Bank and a further £474k in longer term deposits and other accounts. The industry recommendation is that a club of our size should retain cash reserves of at least £500k so that we are in a position to deal with any unexpected reparation costs or unforeseen closures resulting in the loss of income.

The balance of our funds is available to provide long-term funding for capital improvements and investment in the Club's facilities. The capital projects currently under consideration are the new greenkeeping shed; the upgrade of the upstairs toilets and the showers and toilets in the locker rooms; and possible flood alleviation measures.

Despite the strong financial performance up to 30 September 2021, the outlook for the year ahead is a lot less certain. With inflation at its highest level for more than a decade, there will inevitably be an impact on costs. The Club has already seen a significant increase in certain course/Club costs.

Council intends to continue to restrict the number of Full Members to circa 800 and the 2021-22 Budget has been prepared on the assumption that entry fees will be in the region of £25k, which is considerably lower than they have been in the past. Council proposes to increase members' subscriptions by an average of 4% across all categories, except for junior members where fees will remain at the current level.

Overall, the Budget for the current financial year aims to deliver little more than a break-even position in terms of profitability. However, with the relatively modest amount of planned expenditure on replacement equipment and furnishings, there should be a positive cash contribution from business operations to invest in capital projects for the future.

Management

Council thanks all the staff at Deeside for their continuing hard work and dedication in a year of yet more closures and twice weekly COVID testing. That the Club has continued to thrive despite ongoing restrictions is testament to the safe and welcoming environment which the entire team provides for members.

In the kitchen, Head Chef, Mark Ross, supported by Paul Galloway, Paul Dugan and Jude Okharedia, and more recently Marion Henderson, have tickled the taste buds with new dishes (and old favourites) and expanded the range of tasty treats to accompany our ever-popular teas and coffees.

Service with a smile (not to mention fancy dress at every opportunity!) has been provided both inside and out by our fantastic Front of House team, led by Manager, Stewart Greenhalgh, and assisted by Hayden Gerraghty.

Neil McLoughlin, Course Manager, and the Greens Team have battled extreme weather conditions to present the courses and wider grounds to the highest standards.

Whether it be golf equipment or apparel, swing changes or putting problems, Head Professional, Ross McConnachie; Club and Teaching Professional, Graeme Nethercott; and Assistant Professional, Niall Draper, have helped members enjoy their golf – and look good at the same time! The Golf Team has also run all the competitions and made sure that sign in is quick and easy.

And at the centre of it all is the office. There has been a marked increase in administrative processes, including the move to online-only payments, and this has meant more paperwork for Carol Henderson and Pam Fraser.

But the glue holding it all together is Debbie Pern, our Club Manager. While Debbie has continued to work tirelessly throughout the year to keep the Club operating successfully despite ongoing challenges and new initiatives, it is the pastoral care which Debbie provides to members, such as checking up on those who haven't been seen at the Club for a while, which sets her apart from other managers and sets the tone for the entire team.

I extend my personal thanks to all the staff for the support (and steady supply of cups of tea) which they have given me over the last 2 years.

My thanks also to Quintin Aitken, Club President, for his welcoming presence in the Clubhouse and being my chief cheerleader. And to everyone who served with me on Council, thank you for your commitment, contribution and good humour.

Finally, to you, the members, thank you for your kindness, trust and confidence. It has been a privilege to serve you as Captain.

Notes on the Financial Statements – 30 September 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Subscriptions

Annual fees and subscriptions income have been credited to the income and expenditure account on an accruals basis.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation is charged as follows:

Clubhouse	over 50 years
Buggy store	over 25 years
Green keeping sheds	over 20 years
Driving range	over 20 years
Driving range equipment	over 5 years
Fixtures and fittings and course equipment	over 5 years

(c) Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase and finance lease contracts are capitalised as tangible fixed assets and depreciated over their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the Income and Expenditure account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

(d) Government grants

A grant that specifies performance conditions is recognised in income when the performance conditions are met. Where a grant does not specify performance conditions it is recognised in income when the proceeds are received or receivable. A grant received before the recognition criteria are satisfied is recognised as a liability.
